

College, music coordinator and arranger for Christmas Revel, and properties master for Lobero Productions. all in Santa Barbara, CA; properties master for Maine State Music Theatre (Brunswick, ME) and Mac-Haydn Music Theatre (Chatham, NY); and music director for Cabaret and Urinetown The Musical at Graceland University. At Ankeny Community Theatre, she directed Kiss Me. Kate. was music director for The 25th Annual Putnam County Spelling Bee, and was scenic designer and lighting designer for Frankenstein, Honk!, and A Few Good Men. Charissa was assistant director for Tinker Bell and has been on stage in Sister Act and Elephant & Piggie's "We Are in a Play!," all at The Playhouse. A commercial middle market underwriter at Nationwide, Charissa paints and sings jazz in her very limited spare time.

Willson's The Music Man (Marian Paroo), Into the Woods (Cinderella), Les Misérables (Cosette), and Legally Blonde the Musical (Elle Woods). She was the musical director for The Playhouse Performance Academy production of Meredith Willson's The Music Man Jr. and directed Elephant & Piggie's "We Are in a Play!" Katy has also worked with lowa Stage Theatre Company as a resident artist where her performance credits include The Glass Menagerie (Laura) and Our Town (Emily). She also directed their 2018 production of Fun Home. Prior to her time in Des Moines, Katy worked with numerous theatres as a performer, director, and administrator. Jenna Darsee (Stage Manager/ Some Enchanted Evening) literally grew up on The Playhouse stage, from her first role as a Bumblebee in Rumplestilskin to her more recent roles as Ma Ingalls in A Little House Christmas and Mrs. McCarthy in

The Best Christmas Pageant Ever. She has stage managed at Des Moines Young Artists' Theatre. A former Playhouse intern, Jenna joined the theatre's education staff more than five years ago. She is a graduate of Luther College, Decorah, with a B.A. in art with an emphasis in print making and art history. Jenna teaches K-5 art at Irving Elementary, Indianola, and is marketing chair and co-conference chair for the upcoming Art Educators of Iowa conference. In her spare time, she likes visiting the Des Moines Art Center, working on house projects, and playing with her dog, Greta.



Emma Norman (Assistant Stage Manager/Some Enchanted Evening) is familiar to Playhouse audiences as Margaret Leavitt in Silent Sky. Her other area shows include One Flew Over the Cuckoo's Nest (Candy Starr), Gilligan's Island the Musical

(Ginger Grant), and *To Wake the Dead* (Peaches Marie Crabtree), all at Indianola's Carousel Theatre. At Carousel Theatre, she also served as assistant director for *Eurydice*. Emma is a communication specialist for MediaCom. She enjoys theatre, attending Renaissance Festivals, traveling, running, and lifting weights.



Jay Michael Jagim (Scenic Designer) is an lowa Stage Theatre Company member emeritus. He holds a B.A. from the University of Northern lowa and an M.F.A. from the University of Connecticut. His professional credits include resident

scenic designer at the Alley Theatre in Houston, where he designed more than 25 productions including the design and remount of *A Christmas Carol* for 10 seasons. Jay was head of the theatre design and production programs at the University of Arkansas, Little Rock and UC Santa Barbara, where he served for 13 years before returning to lowa. He has designer more than 100 productions for many of the Greater Des Moines theatre companies. He is a four-time Cloris Award winner and, in 2020, received the Cloris Lifetime Achievement Award.



Angela Lampe (Costume Designer/ Properties Designer) began her tenure with The Playhouse in 1993 and has designed costumes, sets, and props for nearly 300 productions including Guys and Dolls. Meredith Willson's The Music

Man, A Gentleman's Guide to Love and Murder, Ella Enchanted, The Miraculous Journey of Edward Tulane, Ragtime, Les Misérables, Disney's The Little Mermaid, West Side Story, Into the Woods, A Streetcar Named Desire, Sunset Boulevard, and Hairspray. She has a B.A. from Central College in Pella and a M.F.A. in theatre from the University of Nebraska. She is the recipient of four Cloris Awards for excellence in costuming and puppetry.



Virgil Kleinhesselink (*Lighting Designer*) owns VTEC Productions sound company and is technical director at Des Moines Hoover High School where he designed lights for their production of *Les Misérables Jr.* Virgil began his Playhouse career in

1979 and since then has been involved with more than 200 shows as designer or actor.

Patrick Flynn (Playwright/The Velveteen Rabbit) is a playwright and filmmaker based in Washington, D.C. His produced stage works include The Ferberizing of Coral (Samuel French Off-Off Broadway Short Play Festival winner), Tinker Bell (Helen Hayes Recommended, Adventure Theatre MTC), Sheila and Moby (Helen Hayes Recommended, Flying V Theatre), and Where in North Dakota Is Carmen Sandiego? (Awesome Con 2018). His podcast The Original Cast was named one of the "7 Standout Theatre Podcasts of 2018" by Playbill. Patrick's web series include I Live With This (Los Angeles Web Series Festival winner), Long Distance Relationship (TIVA-DC Peer Awards Bronze Medal), and Keith Powell Directs a Play (starring 30 Rock's Keith Powell and Aubrey Plaza). He is a 10year veteran of the 48 Hour Film Project and has won six best-of-city awards, three writing awards, and "best film" for his short film For Whom the Whistle Blows. Patrick is a professor at both American University and The Catholic University of America and is a member of the Dramatists Guild

Richard Rodgers (Composer/Some Enchanted Evening) made a contribution to the musical theatre of his day that was extraordinary, and his influence on the musical theatre of today and tomorrow is legendary. His career spanned more than six decades, with his hits ranging from the silver screens of Hollywood to the bright lights of Broadway, London, and beyond. He was the recipient of countless awards, including Pulitzers, Tonys, Oscars, Grammys, and Emmys. He wrote more than 900 published songs and 40 Broadway musicals. Rodgers and Lorenz Hart wrote their first shows together when both were still students attending Columbia University. Over the next five years they wrote 15 musical comedies for Broadway and London's West End before relocating to Hollywood in 1930 where they contributed songs and wrote the scores for several movie musicals. In 1935 they returned to New York to write the score for Billy Rose's circus musical Jumbo, launching a golden era that included On Your Toes, Babes In Arms, I'd Rather Be Right, I Married An Angel, The Boys From Syracuse, Too Many Girls, Higher And Higher, Pal Joey, and By Jupiter. In 1943 the partnership disbanded temporarily when Rodgers collaborated with Oscar Hammerstein II on Oklahoma!, but it resumed with a revision of their 1927 hit A Connecticut Yankee, which opened less than a week before Hart's death. For the next two decades Rodgers collaborated exclusively with Hammerstein on such musicals as Carousel, Allegro, South Pacific, The King And I, Pipe Dream, and The Sound of Music. After Hammerstein's death in 1960, Rodgers continued to write for the musical stage,

including collaborations with Martin Charnin, Stephen Sondheim, and Sheldon Harnick. His fortieth, and final, Broadway musical, *I Remember Mama*, opened on Broadway less than eight months before his death on Dec. 30, 1979. The Richard Rodgers Theatre on Broadway was renamed in his honor, and Rodgers and Hart were each commemorated on a US postage stamp at the end of the last century.

Oscar Hammerstein II (Lyricist/Some Enchanted Evening) started writing lyrics for the Columbia University Varsity shows while studying law. His earliest works included musical comedies written with a Columbia undergraduate seven years his junior named Richard Rodgers. Withdrawing from Columbia Law School after his second year to pursue a career in theatre, Hammerstein took a job with his uncle as an assistant stage manager. In 1919 Hammerstein's first play, The Light, was produced by his Uncle Arthur; it lasted four performances. Undaunted, he continued to write both lyrics and librettos. Hammerstein found his niche with some of the greatest composers of his day, breathing new life into the moribund artform of operetta with such classics as The Desert Song and The New Moon, both with music by Sigmund Romberg, and Song of the Flame with music by George Gershwin. With Jerome Kern, Hammerstein wrote eight musicals including their masterwork, Show Boat. His last musical before embarking on an exclusive partnership with Rodgers was Carmen Jones, the highly-acclaimed 1943 all-black revision of Georges Bizet's tragic opera Carmen. During the years that Hammerstein was redefining the terms of operetta, Richard Rodgers and Lorenz Hart were challenging the accepted norms of musical comedy with shows that set new standards for wit, sophistication, and innovation. Like Hammerstein's Show Boat and Rodgers & Hart's Pal Joey, the first Rodgers & Hammerstein musical, Oklahoma!, was a groundbreaking milestone, blending musical comedy and operetta into a whole new genre – the musical play. Oklahoma! was also the start of the most successful partnership in Broadway history and was followed by Carousel, Allegro, South Pacific, The King And I, Me And Juliet, Pipe Dream, Flower Drum Song, and The Sound of Music. Rodgers & Hammerstein wrote one musical specifically for the big screen (State Fair) and one for television (Cinderella). Collectively, their musicals have garnered dozens of awards including Pulitzer Prizes; Tonys, Oscars, Emmys, and Grammys; and Drama Desk, Drama Critics' Circle, Outer Critics' Circle, Laurence Olivier, and Evening Standard awards. As producers, Rodgers & Hammerstein presented plays, musicals, and revivals, including John van Druten's I Remember Mama, Irving Berlin's blockbuster Annie Get Your Gun, the national tour of Show Boat, and six of their own stage musicals. They also produced the motion picture version of Oklahoma! and founded their own music publishing firm, Williamson Music (basing the name on the fact that both of their fathers were named William). Hammerstein was a member of the board of directors of many professional organizations including the Dramatists Guild and the Screen Writers' Guild. His last musical was The Sound of Music: his

last song was "Edelweiss," written for that musical during its Boston tryout. Hammerstein died at his farm in Doylestown, PA, on Aug. 23, 1960. In 1995 Hammerstein's centennial was celebrated worldwide with commemorative recordings, books, concerts, and an award-winning PBS special, Some Enchanted Evening. The ultimate tribute came the following season, when Hammerstein had three musicals playing on Broadway simultaneously: Show Boat (1995 Tony Award winner, Best Musical Revival); The King and I (1996 Tony Award winner, Best Musical Revival); and State Fair (1996 Tony Award nominee for Best Score.) A revised edition of Hammerstein's Lyrics, edited by his son William Hammerstein and containing an introductory essay by the lyricist plus a preface by his protege Stephen Sondheim, was published by Hal Leonard Publishing in 1985.

Jeffrey B. Moss (*Concept*/Some Enchanted Evening) directed the fabulous Eartha Kitt in the critically acclaimed Lady Day at Emerson's Bar & Grill in Chicago and the premiere of John Nassivera's The Jazz Club for the Coconut Grove Playhouse. He also directed the New York hit musical Mayor, the Broadway-bound production of the Strouse and Adams musical Golden Boy, and the Off-Broadway production of the Cy Coleman/Neil Simon musical Little Me. His production of The Sunshine Boys starring Mickey Rooney and Donald O'Connor delighted audiences from coast to coast. His work This Joint Is Jumpin' has been featured with such prestigious orchestras as The Philadelphia Pops, The Hartford Pops, and The New Orleans Pops. He was the director of the New York and Kennedy Center productions of Some Enchanted Evening and also directed the stage and television productions of Barry Manilow's musical The Drunkard starring Tom Bosley. He directs plays and musicals for many leading regional and stock theaters including The McCarter Theater, The Coconut Grove Playhouse, Falmouth Playhouse, The Cape Playhouse, The John Drew Playhouse, and The American Stage Company, and created a new production of *The Pirates of Penzance* for the SS Leeward. For several years, he created the production shows for the famed King Cole Room, including This Must Be Love and Hooray For Hollywood. Each season, his touring Broadway musicals (including Annie Get Your Gun; The Music Man; My Fair Lady; Peter Pan; Hello, Dolly!; A Chorus Line; 42nd Street; On The Twentieth Century; and Annie) play in theaters across the country and in Canada. Many of these musicals also have traveled to Southeast Asia and have played in Singapore, Hong Kong, Malaysia, Thailand, Indonesia, Manila, and Korea. Moss directed the first American musical production in Mainland China, Red Hot!, and the world premiere of Cole Porter's Aladdin in Singapore.



THE VELVETEEN RABBIT AND SOME ENCHANTED EVENING

Katy Merriman, Artistic Director

One of the perks of being an artistic director is that I'm sometimes lucky enough to get to speak directly to the playwrights whose works we produce. I have been a fan of Patrick Flynn's work since directing Tinker Bell last season and I was excited to hear from him that he had a new adaptation of The Velveteen Rabbit that was ready to be produced. Working directly with Mr. Flynn has given us insight into the play - its structure, how and why it was adapted - that we would never get from the usual methods of licensing a play. He was gracious enough to answer a few questions about his adaptation of The Velveteen Rabbit that I'd like to share with you.

Katy Merriman, Playhouse artistic director: Why is this an important story to tell today?

Patrick Flynn, playwright: This story is over 100 years old and yet it survives and thrives because it wrestles with the complexities of growing up, friendship, and how those relate to our identity. But it does it in simple, bite-sized moments that span several years. It's that structure that has given the story its staying power. It is shockingly relevant today with the child getting ill from scarlet fever at the climax of the show. That moment has become amazingly modern since the show was first produced and the Rabbit's triumph has only gotten sweeter, I think.

Katy: How did you approach bringing life to inanimate toys in a way that would work for the stage (without movie magic, for example)?

Mr. Flynn: Whenever you try to be too clever about stage magic, the audience starts to look for the wires. But if you have the puppets just out there on the stage for all to see, the story and the characters move to the foreground more and the audience can focus. Plus, one has the added bonus of the script being adaptable to any theatre anywhere. Hove big, spectacle-laden shows as much as the next theatre fanboy. But I think theatre for young audiences is a sacred space where we have the chance to do so many things at once: entertain, teach, bring joy, etc. And if the kids see the magic live in front of them and fill in the gaps with their own imagination, they walk away not just entertained but inspired.

Katy: The Skin Horse tells the Velveteen Rabbit, "Real isn't how you are made. It's a thing that happens to you." What do you think Margery Williams meant by that? Is there a message she wants young people to understand about one's identity?

Mr. Flynn: That line really contains multitudes. At the core of it to me is that your experiences, and how you respond to those experiences, make you the person you are. The Rabbit tries on many different hats, learns lessons, makes assumptions, has those assumptions challenged, but in the end does something very hard that turns out to be very simple because it knows it loves the Child and that love is the most important thing. In that moment, it knows who it really is, and it can do anything.

For those of you who are here to see Some Enchanted Evening, know that this is a love note to any patron of music and theatre. After a solid year of pandemic living, we thought a night to celebrate love and enjoy beautiful music was good medicine for audiences. The characters you will meet - Billy, Nellie, Will, Anna, and Julie – are recognizable names from many Rodgers & Hammerstein (known affectionately in theatre circles as R&H) productions but not meant to be played as any specific character. Each name and individual may recall a certain "type" of person in R&H productions, but they are their own developed people telling a story about how everyone experiences romantic love differently, and there isn't a right or wrong way. Don't analyze too deeply - just enjoy the music and these fantastic performers, and they'll take you on a journey.

HOUSE INFORMATION

COVID-19 UNIQUE POLICIES

General Practices

- Guests are required to wear face coverings, such as masks or face shields, and physically distance between groups and parties as much as possible while on the premises.

Seating

- Seats are assigned the day of the performance by staff based on reservation counts and group size. Seats are assigned to ensure physical distancing within the theatre space. Seat requests will be reviewed but not guaranteed. Requests for wheelchair seating will be honored.
- Seating will begin 1 hour prior to curtain to reduce congregating in the theatre.

Concessions

- Concessions are prepacked, individual servings, bottles, or cans.
- · Concessions are available pre-show only.

Restrooms

- Flushing handles, water, soap dispensers, and towel dispensers are touchless to reduce unnecessary contact.
- Identifiers on the floor will guide appropriate distancing for line management.

Stairs & Elevators

- The use of stairwells and elevators will be managed to maintain appropriate physical distancing. Stairwells will be designated one direction only at a time.
- The elevator will be for one person/family/seating group at a time and buttons will be sanitized after each use.

Lobbies

- Lobbies will be managed to ensure appropriate distancing between guests.
- Seating and tables in the lobbies will be reduced to maintain safe distance between groups.

Preshow Talk

A preshow talk for each performance will begin 30 minutes prior to curtain, inside the theatre.

Intermission

There will be no intermission in order to reduce uncontrolled gatherings.

Accessibility

The Playhouse strives to make its facility and performances accessible to all guests. Our theatres are wheelchair accessible. Service animals are welcome. Assisted listening devices are available in the John Viars Theatre. If your hearing aid has a T-coil, toggle to that setting to receive the audio signal directly without any headset or other equipment needed. ASL interpreted performances and audio description are regularly scheduled for most productions. For these and other needs, please call the ticket office with specific service requests.

Cameras
