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
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KINKY BOOTS

Different elements of a show entice different audience members. If you are here today to see *Kinky Boots*, you may be a fan of the 2005 film version, starring Chiwetel Ejiofor, Joel Edgerton, and Sarah-Jane Potts, and written by Geoff Deane and Tim Firth. Perhaps you like drag shows and discovered a musical with multiple showstopping drag numbers fortified by all that Broadway has to offer. There may even be a chance that the title, glitter, and trust in The Playhouse alone were enough to inspire you to purchase tickets. Whatever brought you to the show today, welcome. You are about to see a story told by some of the most talented performers in our area at the exact time a message of love and acceptance is needed in our state and world.

The musical version of *Kinky Boots* began its life in Chicago in 2012 with preview performances at the Bank of America Theatre. The show eventually moved on to Broadway's Al Hirschfield Theatre, opening on Apr. 4, 2013. It ran for 2,507 performances, closing in 2019 after a six-year run. Both the Chicago production and the original Broadway casts featured Billy Porter as Lola, Annaleigh Ashford as Lauren, and Stark Sands as Charlie. Subsequent productions that followed the Broadway premiere of *Kinky Boots* included a run at the Royal Alexandra Theatre in Toronto, a U.S. Tour, a run of over 1,400 performances in the West End's Adelphi Theatre, and international tours in more than 10 countries.

The movie and musical are based on the true story of Steve Pateman, who had taken over leadership of a failing shoe factory, WJ Brookes, in Earls Barton in Northamptonshire, England. In his search for a more competitive shoe market, he ended up on a call with Sue Sheppard, owner of Lacies, a store that sold specialist glamour wear for transgender customers. Sue was having trouble finding traditional "women's" shoes that were the correct size for male-bodied customers who needed more structural support and a bigger shoe size. You'll find out the rest of that story in just a few minutes.

Harvey Fierstein, a four-time Tony winner, was hired to write the book for the stage adaptation of the film. A few prior works in his successful career were also stories about drag – *La Cage aux Folles* and *Torch Song Trilogy*. However Fierstein's musical partner, Cyndi Lauper, made her Broadway songwriting debut with *Kinky Boots*. Lauper was a friend of Fierstein's and had previous musical theatre experience as a performer (in addition to her widespread musical fame), but *Kinky Boots* was her first go at writing music for a full-scale production. Being new to the job didn't keep the show from succeeding. The writing team, along with cast and crew, won six 2013 Tony Awards for *Kinky Boots*, including Best Musical.

I've had my share of eye rolls at "another movie musical," but when you get down to it, there are plenty of adaptations that have had fantastic success on Broadway, including *Kinky Boots*. With a book and music by Harvey Fierstein and Cyndi Lauper, and the story inspired by Steve Pateman's "Divine Footwear," it is no wonder the show is such a success. If a story is worth telling, we should tell it in however many forms it takes to get the message to the world.

If a show is cancelled due to bad weather, an email will be sent to ticket holders. Cancellations will be noted on the phone system, website, and social media sites. Tickets for a cancelled performance may be exchanged for another performance. Please be sure the ticket office has your email information and current phone in the event a performance is cancelled. The Playhouse does not sell its contacts and does not sell or trade its email addresses.

Concessions

A variety of beverages and candy may be available for purchase and are allowed in auditoriums. No outside drink or food are allowed. Staff reserve the right to deny alcoholic beverage service to anyone at their discretion.

Flevator

An elevator between levels is located at the east end of the building.

Please note the exit nearest your seat location. In the event of an emergency, ushers will provide direction.

Etiquette

Latecomers will be seated at an appropriate break in the play. Lobby chimes are sounded five minutes before curtain as well as the close of intermission.

Disruptive, unruly guests, regardless of age, will be asked to leave. Cell phone ringers should be turned off.

Free parking is available in The Playhouse lots and on streets surrounding the theatre. After 5:00 PM daily, free parking is available in the Shops at Roosevelt's east/back parking lot. Performance Content

The Playhouse does not rate subject matter as sensitivities vary from person to person. Questions about content, age appropriateness, or other aspects of the show such as strobe lights and other theatrical affects should be directed to the ticket office.

Performance Schedule

The regular John Viars Theatre performance schedule is 7:30 PM Wednesdays through Saturdays, and 2:00 PM Sundays. The regular Kate Goldman Children's Theatre performance schedule is 7:00 PM Fridays, and 1:00 PM and 4:00 PM Saturdays and Sundays. The Family Holiday Classic performance schedule is 7:00 PM Fridays, and 1:00 PM and 5:00 PM Saturdays and Sundays. All times are subject to change.

Preshow Talk

A preshow talk for each John Viars Theatre performance will begin 30 minutes prior to curtain in the west lobby.

Tickets

Each audience member must occupy a seat and have a ticket, including infants.

Ticket Office Hours

The ticket office is open Noon to 5:00 PM, Tuesday through Friday, and 90 minutes before each performance. Tickets are available 24 hours a day. seven days a week, online. Ticketing fees are the same whether purchased online, by phone, or at the ticket office



Affair (12 Drama Desk nominations and the Drama League Award for Best Musical). His La Cage Aux Folles is the only show to ever win Best Musical and two Best Revival Tony Awards. Other plays include Spookhouse, Forget Him, and Flatbush Tosca. His teleplays include Tidy Endings for HBO (ACE Award) and On Common Ground for Showtime. His children's HBO special, The Sissy Duckling, won the Humanitas Prize and the book version is in its eighth printing. Other honors include the Drama League Award for Outstanding Performer of the Year, a special OBIE award, NY Magazine Award, and nominations for The Olivier Award and an Emmy. His political writings have been seen on PBS' series "In The Life" and published in The New York Times, Huffington Post, and Hartford Courant. He was inducted into the Theater Hall of Fame in 2008.



Cyndi Lauper (Music & Lyrics) is a Grammy, Emmy, and Tony award-winning artist with over 30 sterling years and global record sales in excess of 50 million albums. With her first album, "She's So Unusual," Lauper won a Grammy Award for Best New

Artist and became the first female in history to have four top-five singles from a debut album. Since then, Lauper has released 10 additional studio albums, been inducted into the Songwriters Hall of Fame, and celebrated as a New York Times best-selling author. Overall, during her storied music career, Lauper has been nominated for 15 Grammy Awards, two American Music Awards, seven American Video Awards, and 18 MTV Awards. In 2013, Lauper became the first solo woman to win Best Original Score for her music and lyrics for Kinky Boots. Never one to slow down, she is currently writing the score for the Broadway adaptation of the 1988 feature film Working Girl. She contributed a song to the score of the Broadway musical Spongebob Squarepants and launched her own fashion line, A Touch of Cyn, with Home Shopping Network.



Tim Firth (Original Screenplay) was born in Wirral, Merseyside, in the northwest of England. He spent most of his time at his Warrington comprehensive school writing songs and it was only a couple of months before going to Cambridge to read

English that he attended an Arvon Foundation course in West Yorkshire. This was run by Willy Russell and whilst on it, Firth had to write dialogue. He wrote about the only thing he knew: two 16-year-olds trying to write a song. Another course participant optioned it for his production company and Firth decided to become a writer. While at Cambridge he joined and composed songs for the Footlights where his contemporaries included David Baddiel who later invited him to contribute music to The Mary Whitehouse Experience on BBC radio. His first plays at this time were all directed by Sam Mendes. On leaving Cambridge, he wrote and composed music for the Radio Four series And Now In Colour but was soon invited to meet Alan Ayckbourn in Scarborough and commissioned to write a play for the Stephen Joseph Theatre. His oneact play A Man Of Letters was a success and led to the commissioning of a full-length play from Ayckbourn, Neville's Island, which later transferred to the West End and has been seen in translation all round the world in almost continuous production since its premiere. During two successive Christmas runs, his stage musical version of his ty film The Flint Street Nativity at the Liverpool Playhouse became the most successful Christmas production in the theatre's history. The play Calendar Girls, adapted by Firth from his own film, found favor with audiences across the UK during its 2008/09 tour, and in the process broke the all-time British box office record for a play and continued to sell out during its West

End residency. In 2010, the hit comedy embarked on a UK country wide tour, one of the largest ever for a play. Calendar Girls is also a success across the globe, playing in Germany, Finland, Norway, Denmark, Sweden, Israel, Greece, Argentina, France, Czech Republic, Belgium, Holland, Hungary, Poland, Spain, Australia, New Zealand, Canada, Russia, Bulgaria, and Slovakia. In 2011, it beat the all-time British box office record for a play and has since raised over half a million British pounds for Blood Cancer Charities, funding its own research project in Yorkshire hospitals. In an 18-month window, Amateur Rights were snapped up by over 500 amateur dramatic groups across the UK and the rest of the world. 2013 marked the premiere of Firth's first solo musical, This Is My Family, for which he wrote the book, lyrics, and music. Directed by Daniel Evans, it premiered at Sheffield Studio Theatre on 19 June 2013. This Is My Family won the UK Theatre Award for Best New Musical and Sian Philips won Best Supporting Actress. In 2015, Tim Firth and Ivor Novello award-winning songwriter Gary Barlow cowrote The Girls, based on the story of the Calendar Girls. Directed by Roger Haines and Tim Firth, the new musical opened at Leeds Grand Theatre in November. The show then moved to The Lowry in Manchester in January 2016. In all, The Girls played 60 sold-out performances, complete with 60 standing ovations, and was seen by just under 100,000 people. It is anticipated The Girls will move to the West End. In 2004 Firth released a solo album, Harmless Flirting, completing a tour of words and music with fellow playwright Willy Russell that won positive reviews at the Edinburgh Festival. In March 2010, Firth was awarded an honorary Doctorate by the University of Chester. Tim helps run the choir at Alvanley Primary School in Cheshire.

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
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
