Accessibility

ASL interpreted performances and audio description performances are available upon request. For these and other needs, please call the ticket office with specific service requests.

Cameras

The taking of photographs and the use of recording devices are not allowed during a performance and are a violation of state and federal copyright laws.

Cancellations

If a show is cancelled due to bad weather, an email will be sent to ticket holders. Cancellations will be noted on the phone system, website, and social media sites. Tickets for a cancelled performance may be exchanged for another performance. Please be sure the ticket office has your email information and current phone in the event a performance is cancelled. The Playhouse does not sell its contacts and does not sell or trade its email addresses.

Concessions

A variety of beverages and candy may be available for purchase and are allowed in auditoriums. No outside drink or food are allowed. Staff reserve the right to deny alcoholic beverage service to anyone at their discretion.

Flevator

An elevator between levels is located at the east end of the building.

Emergency Exits

The Family Holiday Classic performance schedule is 7:00 PM Fridays, and 1:00 PM and 5:00 PM Saturdays and Sundays. All times are subject to change.

A preshow talk for each John Viars Theatre performance will begin 30 minutes prior to curtain in the west lobby.

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
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

GUYS AND DOLLS

Guys and Dolls began as an adaptation of two short stories penned by Damon Runyon. Runyon, born 1880, is best known for the particular type of gambling, hustling New Yorker he portrayed in his short stories; a "Runyonesque" character type so distinct, they're known right down to the colorful moniker and distinctive dialect ("Runyonese").

"Good Time Charlie," "The Seldom Seen Kid," "Big Jule," and "Nicely Nicely Johnson" are only a few of the many characters who mix elevated language of the early 20th century with slang from the underbelly of New York City. If you're still unsure of what this language sounds like, you're about to hear 12 crap-shooting sinners demonstrate it for you.



As we prepared a 2022 production of *Guys and Dolls* at The Playhouse, we discovered that many of us have early theatre experiences with this particular show. A favorite of American theatres, both community based and professional, perhaps some of you are seeing this show for the second, third, or tenth time. You may fondly remember playing Sky Masterson in your high school spring musical or, for me, the third ensemble girl from the left in the background of "Take Back Your Mink" and a horn player in the Mission Band (dreams of playing Sarahs and Adelaides were yet to be realized for me at age 14).

Whether this is your first experience or twentieth, I hope *Guys and Dolls* whisks you away to a simpler, fantastical, *comical* version of early New York City where the crap games are a-plenty and there is no one way to find love. We're all flawed, life is chaotic and funny, and we'd best enjoy the hell out of it, whether converting sinners or selling newspapers.

Please enjoy this "whole beautiful thing;" an outrageous fable in a bright and fictional New York City filled with the "best" and "worst" of Runyonland.
