



THE PLAY THAT GOES WRONG

Katy Merriman, Playhouse Artistic Director

If you are not yet familiar with *The Play That Goes Wrong*, buckle up! This one is going to make your day. Even seasoned critics like Ben Brantley of the *New York Times* called it "A gut-busting hit!" The Chicago Tribune said it was "Remarkable! You start to think that maybe the day you are having, or the year, really is not so bad after all!"

This critical acclaim and dig at the day or year we've been having ties in nicely with the history of the run of *The Play That Goes Wrong*. The show made its West End debut at the Duchess Theatre in 2014, where it remains the longest running play at the Duchess. It won Best New Comedy at the 2015 Laurence Olivier Awards (the British Tonys if you're not a devout theatre nerd). The long run of the show branched into successful British and U.S. Tours that were interrupted by the COVID-19 pandemic in 2020 (a tough year for most of us). Many of you remember the abrupt halt the pandemic put on theatre world-wide, but we also saw creative pivots.

The creators of *The Play that Goes Wrong* – Henry Lewis, Jonathan Sayer, and Henry Shields – are

members of Mischief Theatre Company, a group they founded in 2008 as students at the London Academy of Music and Dramatic Art. During the pandemic, Mischief Theatre was a troupe with pivots! They put on improvised comedy shows called *Mischief Movie Night* in outdoor venues in August and September of 2020 and started a podcast called "Mischief Makers." When national lockdown procedures shut down the open-air performances, they produced the show online and called it *Mischief Movie Night In*.

The creative joy and genius of the Mischief Theatre Company is obvious in the performance you're about to witness. The bulk of performances generated by Mischief Theatre center around a fictional drama group, The Cornley Drama Society. In the original West End production, Mischief members remained in the cast as their Cornley characters playing roles in the fictional drama *The Murder at Haversham Manor.* This might be confusing if you're not familiar with the show or its origin, so here is a helpful guide to study thoroughly in the next five minutes before the show begins.


