### **All is Calm** Katy Merriman, Playhouse Artistic Director

*All is Calm: The Christmas Truce of 1914*, is sure to be one of the most unique and beautiful holiday performances in our theatre's history. Originally broadcast live in 2007 as a radio production, it has since been performed throughout the U.S. and Canada and broadcast on five continents. Though it has been heard and performed the world over, *All is Calm* originated just a few hours north in Minneapolis, from a team of composers and arrangers who are Minnesota based and world renowned.

Peter Rothstein created *All is Calm* while working with the award-winning Theatre Latté Da in Minneapolis, for whom he has directed more than 80 productions. Named 2015 Artist of the Year by the *Star Tribune*, Rothstein has also collaborated with the Guthrie Theater, The Children's Theatre Company, Minnesota Opera, and with arts organizations across the nation. His fellow collaborators have similarly impressive resumes.

Arranger Eric Lichte was a founding member and artistic director of the male vocal ensemble Cantus. (Perhaps a few audience members even listened to a few holiday tunes recorded by Cantus on the way here?) Lichte went on to lead the Chor Leoni Men's Choir, transforming the ensemble into one of the best male choirs in North America.

Timothy Takach, a second arranger of today's work, is a composer based in Minneapolis whose work has been featured on A Prairie Home Companion, The Boston Pops holiday tour, and at the Kennedy Center to name just a few. Though this talented team is too far north to fall under the "Iowa pride" umbrella, I think it's worth noting that a work such as this originated so close to home.

*All is Calm* has obvious historical appeal, but the music is what defines the telling of this story. According to the show's web page, Rothstein believes that music, an important part of life in the trenches, helped create a context that made the truce possible. "Music was the common language, and as winter set in, the men began to hold impromptu concerts, singing to each other across the battle fields, creating trust and a camaraderie." (alliscalm.org/theater-latte-da) Rothstein has



intentionally let the music, supplemented by historical writings, guide the form of *All is Calm*, and the story doesn't require much beyond that. The patriotic American songs, trench tunes, and medieval ballads and carols from England, Wales, France, Belgium, and Germany say all that is needed. As Rothstein said, "Their story puts a human face on war, and that's the story I hope to tell."

You will notice in today's performance that many of the performers identify their name, rank, and country of origin after speaking. This is an intentional choice that we hope you embrace. Rothstein notes that many of the men whose words build the spoken portions of the show never appeared in written history. The repetition of their names today not only honors their place in history, but it also reminds listeners that the words you are hearing today come directly from the men who lived this story.

**Charles M. Schulz** (*Creator*/A Charlie Brown Christmas) was born in Minneapolis, on Nov. 26, 1922. His *Peanuts* comic strip debuted in 1950 in just seven newspapers and when he announced his retirement in December 1999, *Peanuts* was syndicated in over 2,600 newspapers worldwide, with book collections translated in over 25 languages. The recipient of two Reuben Awards from the National Cartoonists Society and inductee into the Cartoonist Hall of Fame, Charles also scripted and storyboarded numerous television specials, earning five Emmy and two Peabody Awards. Charles died on Feb. 13, 2000, but his *Peanuts* gang continues to entertain and inspire the young and the young at heart.

Jose Cuauhtémoc (Bill) Melendez (TV Special Creator/A Charlie Brown Christmas) was hired by Walt Disney in 1938 and contributed his talents to such projects as Fantasia, Dumbo, Pinnocchio, and Bambi. He founded his own production company, Bill Melendez Productions, Inc., in 1964. Besides his commercial work, Bill produced his first television special, A Charlie Brown Christmas, and received both an Emmy Award (the first of eight) and the prestigious George Foster Peabody Award for Outstanding Children's Program. In addition to numerous awards and nominations for his Peanuts work, Bill won an Emmy in 1975 for Yes, Virginia, There is a Santa Claus; an Emmy (the first awarded in the specific category of Animation)

for *The Lion, The Witch and The Wardrobe,* as well as an individual Emmy for authoring that show's script. Bill Melendez Productions was the first to animate Jim Davis' "Garfield the Cat," and that first special won an Emmy Award in 1982.

Lee Mendelson (TV Special Creator/A Charlie Brown Christmas), along with Charles Schulz and animator Bill Melendez, produced 45 "Peanuts" prime-time specials. He was also the executive producer of four "Peanuts" animated feature films. Lee produced 12 "Garfield" prime-time specials as well as a 120-program series. Garfield and Friends. His first of four "Peanuts" movies (A Boy Named Charlie Brown) received an Oscar nomination for Best Musical Score and the "Peanuts" music has received four Grammy nominations. Lee is the author of the book A Charlie Brown Christmas: The Making of a Tradition, which was on The New York Times Bestseller List for eight weeks and sold over 200,000 copies, as well as two other books on Charles Schulz. He was the lyricist for "Christmas Time Is Here." (music by Vince Guaraldi for A Charlie Brown Christmas) which has become a Christmas standard. The music from the "Peanuts" shows has sold over 4 million albums, and has been performed by such artists as Vince Guaraldi, David Benoit, Wynton Marsalis, George Winston, and Sarah MacLachlan.


Eric Schaeffer (Stage Adaptation/A Charlie Brown Christmas) co-founded Signature Theatre in Arlington, VA, in 1989 and was its artistic director for three decades. The theatre received the 2009 Regional Theatre Tony Award and became home to the American Musical Voices Project (AMVP) – the largest musical commission program in America. Eric has directed *Gigi, Follies, Million Dollar Quartet, Glory Days,* and *Putting It Together* on Broadway. At the Kennedy Center, he served as artistic director of the Sondheim Celebration, where he also directed *Sunday in the Park With George* and *Passion,* along with Mame, *Follies,* and *First You Dream*. He has received six Helen Hayes Awards for outstanding direction, eight Helen Hayes Awards for outstanding musical, 31 Helen Hayes Award nominations for outstanding director and the Washington Arts Founder Award.

Arthur Whitelaw (Producer/A Charlie Brown Christmas) has been producing, directing, writing, and acting for the past 61 years. His productions have won every major industry award, including the Tony, Oscar, Emmy, Olivier, Evening Standard, Drama Desk, Outer Critics Circle. etc. His television shows include: You're a Good Man, Charlie Brown, (NBC, Emmy nomination); Celebrating Gershwin (PBS/ BBC, Emmy Winner); and for HBO, Camelot, The Rainmaker, Separate Tables, Bus Stop, Barefoot in the Park, Plaza Suite, Sherlock Holmes, Vanities, Wait Until Dark, The Deadly Game, and Groucho. His film credits include Butterflies are Free, Tom Sawyer, and Huckleberry Finn with Jodie Foster. He has just finished his autobiography, Working For Peanuts. Last year Arthur donated his vast theatre files to the Library of Congress.



Katy Merriman (Artistic Director) has been an active member of the local theatre community since moving to Des Moines in 2013. Her Playhouse directing credits include Go, Dog. Gol; Guys and Dolls; The Sound of Music; the world premiere

of Escaping the Labyrinth; A Love Offering (co-directed with Tiffany Johnson and Pyramid Theatre Company); and I and You. Other local performance and directing credits include The Glass Menagerie (Laura), King Lear (Cordelia), Our Town (Emily), and Fun Home (director) with Iowa Stage Theatre Company. She has coached for Iowa High School Speech Association and will adjudicate the monologue competition this summer at American Association of Community Theatre's national festival. Prior to her time in Des Moines, Katy worked with numerous theatres in the Midwest as a performer, director, musician, and administrator.




